Based upon a 2004 Government Accountability Office Report, the Department of Defense (DoD) commenced the declassification of select chemical and biological agent test programs. As a result, DoD now provides the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) with test program information and a database for each declassified test program for the purposes of outreach, claims adjudication, and health care. Note: A systematic DoD test declassification plan does not exist.
