I write regarding the protective order covering third-party information that you have proposed. We believe that we will be able to agree to a stipulated proposed order and are currently in the process of working with our clients to craft language that both protects the interests of third parties and facilitates discovery.

Before we can send you proposed changes to your draft, however, we need additional information from you. On June 30, after Mr. Erspamer left the meet-and-confer session, we revisited the protective order issue with you and explained Defendants' concerns about individual test participants being contacted. You indicated that you would let us know how Plaintiffs propose that any organizational plaintiff representatives would use the information identifying participants if given access. We have not received that information and request that you send it as soon as possible.
