Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1746, I hereby declare as follows:

- 1. I am the Program Manager, Medical Care Injunction for Participants of Chemical or Biological Substance Testing Programs, Army Public Health Center (APHC), U.S. Army Medical Command (MEDCOM), and the MEDCOM Field Operating Agency with responsibility for supporting the U. S. Army in relation to this litigation. I am familiar with this litigation based upon information received from my staff and legal advisors within MEDCOM.
- 2. As of December 13, 2018, the Army has received 143 applications, 101 of which were deemed complete and reviewed by a BAP. BAP recommended approval for medical care for 69 of the applications for some or all of the conditions listed on the application, and recommended against approval for medical care in 32 cases.
- 3. As of December 13, 2018, the remaining 42 applications are either in progress, of which the Army has requested additional information for incomplete applications (32); or closed the application due to veteran declining further participation or the death of the applicant (10 applications).

4. As of December 14, 2018, of the 69 applications recommended for SECDES approval by the BAP, six (6) have received SECDES approval for all or some of the diagnosed conditions, and 63 applications are pending SECDES Program approval.
